Alex Yontz Wins at Newport Speedway

The No. 77 C&J Energy Services team benefits from a double points weekend



Lexington, NC — Alex Yontz was declared the winner of Saturday night's 150-lap UARA-STARS race at Newport Speedway. The win is his first of the season, but he plans to keep the momentum going over the next few weeks.

“This is motivation for me and everyone on the team. We’ve had some good runs lately. It’ll be good to keep that going through the last two races now that we’ve got us a win,” said Yontz.

The No. 77 C&J Energy Services team was the fastest during practice Friday and earned an eighth

place starting position during qualifying on Saturday.

Once the green flag dropped, the fight was on for first place. Roger Powell took the lead from Brennan Poole on lap 3. Powell was only able to stay in first for 49 laps, before Steven Wallace moved to the front of the pack.

With about 20 laps to go Yontz pulled up to Brennan Poole’s door who was running in second. They drove hard into the corner and made contact. Poole spun around while Yontz slipped into second place.

Wallace crossed the finish line first, but was disqualified after the post race inspection revealed an illegal intake. Yontz and the No. 77 C&J Energy Services team were declared the winner.

This was an important weekend for UARA drivers since series officials decided to make Newport a double points event instead of rescheduling the race that was rained out at Ace Speedway on September 17.

Yontz was more than excited about the win and hopes to score a couple more for C&J Energy Services before the end of the 2011 race season.

“I cannot thank C&J Energy Services enough for their support this season. We plan to carry this momentum over into the next couple of races and earn more wins for them.”

The next event is October 29 at Concord Speedway. Teams qualify at 5 PM and the racing action starts at 7 PM.
