The UARA-STARS Series heads to Greenville Pickens

Cardinal Motorsports has tough race weekend



Lexington, NC — The UARA-STARS series traveled to Anderson, SC on Saturday for the Pacific Equipment 150. A total of 23 cars qualified for the 150-lap event including Alex Yontz in the No. 77 C&J Energy Services car.

Yontz and the Cardinal Motorsports team felt good going into Saturday night's race after running third in practice earlier that morning. He maneuvered his way into the top-five after the race started and stayed there until the finish. Yontz took fourth place.

Following post race inspection, the No. 77 car was disqualified due to an unapproved part. The team will make a decision this week on whether they will appeal the ruling.

“I was proud of the way Alex drove tonight. We were excited about another top-five finish. But, we are going to take a closer look at the ruling by UARA officials and make a decision on whether we are going to file an appeal,” said Ed Berrier, crew chief for the No. 77 team.

Yontz moved to seventh place in the UARA-STARS driver points.

The team's next event is at Martinsville Speedway for the Virginia is for Racing Lovers 300 on October 9. This event draws Late Model Stock Car teams from all over the U.S. to participate each year. Qualifying is on Saturday, October 8 and the race is at 3 p.m. on Sunday.
